Annie is a moderate mom and housing advocate who has spent her entire life working with everyone to build strong communities and that's the work she'll continue in the State Senate.

Annie doesn't think you should need an IPO to afford a home. She doesn't think it should take hours and hours stuck in traffic to get to work. And as the mother of a son who was temporarily driven to homelessness by addiction, she knows we need a comprehensive approach to treat drug addiction and mental health issues if we are truly serious about ending homelessness.

As a Realtor, Annie brings a unique experience to this issue and will work to make sure our children and grandchildren can stay and raise families of their own here. She has served on the Millbrae City Council since 2013, including as Mayor. She champions improving public safety, enhancing economic development, and building more housing near transit so we don't make traffic gridlock worse.

Annie has spent her whole life in this community. She was born and raised on the Peninsula, and her three children were born and raised here too. She and Jose, her husband of 36 years, currently live in Millbrae.

HOUSING

The defining issue in our region and the state is housing affordability. Annie is the only candidate in the race who works every day to help residents find homes. She understands in the deepest sense the economic and social benefits of helping families realize their dream of home ownership. On the Millbrae City Council, she works to build



more affordable housing near transit for seniors and veterans. As your next state senator, she will fight for short- and long-term housing solutions that leverage emerging technologies, public-private partnerships and convene state and local leaders to get the job done, while keeping key decision making local.

HOMELESSNESS AND ADDICTION

Annie will fight to improve drug and alcohol treatment and mental health care options, including expanded use of “conservatorship” to help our homeless neighbors who are a danger to themselves and others. She’ll also work to fund more jobs for the unhoused — so people can earn their way off of the street in a dignified way. And of course, she will fight for a significant increase in affordable housing.

TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORTATION

Annie believes the “super commutes” that have become all too common in the Bay Area threaten our environment and our quality of life. The transportation sector is responsible for nearly half of greenhouse gas emissions that lead to climate change, poor air quality, and rising sea levels. Annie will make sure we invest in reliable public transportation, like the Caltrain electrification project, and build housing near transit and job centers so people can work in the same communities where they live.
